Why do we celebrate Christmas on December 25th

since we know that . . .

1) Jesus was probably born in September in Bethlehem. Isreal seldom has temperatures lower than 45 degrees Farenheit, so "on a cold winter's night" does not apply.

2) The star that the wise men followed actually appeared the night Christ was born. The wise men (Magi) were from Media and Persia. It took them about two years traveling west to reach the child Jesus, so they did not visit Jesus at the same time the shepherds did, since the shepherds saw Jesus on the night of His birth.

3) A Roman bishop chose December 25th as a day to celebrate Jesus' birth in 354 A.D. Romans already celebrated this day as the "Feast of Saturn", the birthday of the sun. Christians say Jesus is the 'Light of the world', so Christian Romans were able to celebrate on the same day without offending other Romans.

4) People in the United States equate Christmas with commercialism, gross over spending, Santa Claus, etc ~ anything and everything but Christ's day. Yet we at RHCF along with thousands of churches across the country and the world, choose to celebrate this day and season as a time to show unity of faith and teach our children the truth about our blessed Savior's birth.

Romans 14:5 - 6a says, "One man esteemeth one day above another: another esteemeth every day alike. Let every man be fully persuaded in his own mind. He that regardeth the day, regardeth it unto the Lord; and he that regardeth not the day, to the Lord doth not regard it." And verse 10 in the same chapter admonishes us not to judge one another in this manner.
